- IV. Updates

- 2. Farmers Market—Terry would like to see a breakdown of sales per week/month
- 3. Merchant Mixer—Tabled
- 4. Electrical Box Wraps—The Art Commission meets on 9/23 to discuss
- 5. Parklet Program
 - A. Electrical has been approved by Mike Klein for overhead only and must be done by a licensed electrician.
 - B. The Parklets are owned by the RVA
 - C. We will need at least one business on each side of street who can provide a GFI on the roof; the install will be about \$700, and the lights will cost about \$2,500 per parklet.
 - D. Motion by Lovette Mioni to have the RVA BID pay for each install of overhead lights; Brian 2nd— APPROVED
 - E. Motion by Lovette Mioni to give authority to allocate the remaining monies (approx. \$43,000) to the Parklet committee. 2nd by Brian—Approved
 - F. For the parklet program to continue they must be rebuilt properly to accommodate the findings of the hydrology study; Currently they are only approved until October 15.
 - G. Allen and Jeff said we should consider having a parking study completed before inside dining is allowed again and then after. This data can be used to show the City and the Coastal Commission the parklets are not a hindrance to parking in the Village. This may help keep the parklets even post Covid restrictions.

V. Non-Bord Members

1. Nils Nehrenheim—The city has allocated \$50,000 toward the paver project in the Village; if the RVA has any thoughts of this parklet program continuing beyond the pandemic he suggests we show/prove there are no parking issues in the Village and the community is in full support. Stephen Proud suggests we do a study which includes businesses and employees.
